Mr Greenslade has represented the Parish as our Cornwall Councillor for several terms in office, providing support to residents on various issues. Prior the formation of the Unitary Council that we know today, Mr Greenslade served as our representative on the Borough of Restormel Council, he was also a hardworking and dedicated Parish Councillor giving over 20 years of sevice. We wish Mr Greenslade all the best for the future and hope that he enjoys a long and happy retirement.

<u>New Cornwall Councillor</u> As a result of the election on the 6th May we would like to extend a warm welcome Cllr Dick Cole, our new representative within Cornwall Council. We would like to congratulate Mr Cole on his appointment to office and look forward to working with him in the future.

Proposed Solar Farm Development - Following the announcement that there is to be a planning application put forward to Cornwall Council for the development of a large solar farm in the Parish by Statkraft, an initial meeting with representatives of Statkraft, Councillors, and members of the public was held on 28th April. The development was explained, and a number of local concerns were raised, including the size of the development, the potential detrimental effects to local flora and wildlife, and the negative aesthetic effect on the environment. We are inviting Parishioners to come forward with their views, and concerns, so that we may take them into consideration when submitting our consultation response to the planning application.

Anti-social behaviour in The Playing Fields - We have had several complaints regarding young people behaving very badly in the Playing Field. Consequently, some residents are reluctant to allow their children to use the area. This facility is for the use of all residents and it is a terrible shame that the behaviour of a few is preventing others enjoying it. We have had another incident of fly-tipping, this time of a mattress. Again, this has cost the Council to remove. Please ensure you use the correct County Council facilities when disposing of large items of waste. Because of these issues, the Parish Council will be installing CCTV in the Playing Field this year. We are hoping that this will be a preventative measure and save the Council from costly repairs and rubbish clearance and enable everyone to use the Playing Field with pleasure.
